He leads the Australian Human Resources Institute-sponsored research program investigating the characteristics of exceptional executive coaching. His research has been published in the business and academic press, and has been presented to the Australian Psychological Society, Melbourne Business School, ICF in the US, and the Australian Human Resources Institute national conference.

Gavin completed his Masters at Massey in Albany studying cognitive performance in fatigue conditions, and his Ph.D. at Victoria University, Melbourne, studying career transitions in elite sportspeople.
